Challenge Championship Race Notes

DISTANCE: Trainer Paul Jones won this race in '05 & '07 and looks for a 3rd title with favorite Snowbound Superstar. 'Snowbound can become the 3rd 2-time Distance champ.

JUVENILE: Blane Schvaneveldt seeks a record-padding 4th training win in this race with 5-2 morning line pick Hoist Mission.

DERBY: Trainer Hector Hernandez aims for his 2nd Derby win in the past 3 years with 9-5 favorite Saturday Nite Fever.

DISTAFF: Three of the 10 finalists hail from the Paul Jones barn (Strength In Numbers, Stylish Jess BR, Answer the Dream).

CHAMPIONSHIP: Rylees Boy could give trainer Joe Badilla, Jr. a rare career double: Challenge wins as a trainer and jockey.

STARTER: Trainers Bill Hoburg and Eddie Willis have accounted for 2 of the last 3 wins in this race, and will be represented by Dashing Strawfly and the duo of Mister Jess Legacy and Eye Zoom Too, respectively.

TERRY'S HP PRO ALERTS:

Race – 7 #7 HOIST MISSION
Our Eyes: Peaking at the right time for all-time Los Alamitos leading trainer Blane Schvaneveldt. He has come away super in both Los Alamitos outings, finishing second in a PCQHRA Breeders Futurity trial vs. eventual futurity runner-up Headturner before winning the Autumn Handicap in a sharp 17.43 for 350 yards. Take the 5-2 morning-line price from post number seven.

Race – 10 #7 LITTLE BIT OF BAJA
Our Eyes: Gelding has too much class and is a late Pick Four single. He relishes the 440-yard distance, having run second in the last two Champion Of Champions. He came within a head of beating Jess You And I when the latter set a 440-yard track record of 20.94 in capturing the 2008 Champion Of Champions. As long as he breaks alertly, he should qualify for his third Champion Of Champions. Price of 9-5 is a bargain.

Race – 11 #7 MISTER JESS LEGACY
Our Eyes: Nice value at 10-1. He had inside post draws when third and fourth, respectively, in his last two Oklahoma outings and won twice under the lights at Remington Park last May. One of those victories came vs. rival Eyesa High, who since won the Central Starter Challenge at Canterbury Downs. Willie Swings, the 2-1 morning-line favorite, seems vulnerable while making his third start in 28 days.



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
